You may recall, his exchange partner, Alessandro, was at our daughter Angie's house back in October for two weeks. What an opportunity for a 7th grader. I believe I made it all the way to Funkstown by the 7th grade.

Our daughter Angie (Colin & Brady's Mom) recently received recognition from the Orange County Department of Education for her efforts in getting elementary children to participate in a regular exercise and nutrition program. Angie runs the Orange County Marathon that includes a kids "Marathon" on Saturday and the adult marathon on Sunday. The "Marathon" for elementary kids requires each student to run the first 25 miles in one mile segments on a regular basis before "Marathon" day. On "Marathon" day, the students run their last 1+ mile "Marathon" to complete the full marathon distance of 26+ miles.

Those who complete the "Marathon" are awarded a medal in recognition of their effort. They receive their medal at an assembly for all the students of their school. When the medal is hung on their neck in front of their peers, teachers and family they smile with great pride. The program started with hundreds of participants from a handful of schools and has grown to 4500 students from 70 schools. The program offers scholarships to all at risk youth in need and provides the curriculum and the volunteer/teacher training at no cost to schools.


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
