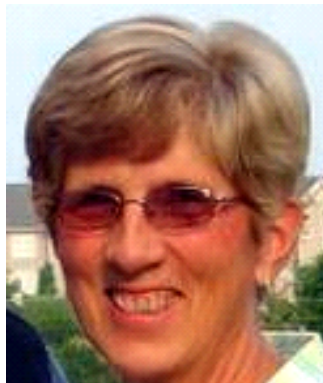
GET WELL WISHES

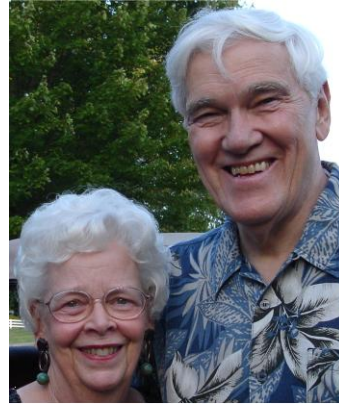

The flights were uneventful except for one miss placed piece of the Strock luggage. Thankfully, it was not my golf clubs. Clothes can be bought, golf clubs are rather expensive. The misplaced luggage was delivered to our B&B on Saturday.

Our driver & coach met us at the Shannon Airport for the trip to Cork for our first 3 nights at the Coach Hill House Bed & Breakfast. We toured the town of Kinsale on the Celtic Sea Thursday afternoon and had a late lunch at the Fishy Fishy Shop. Our driver happened to be from Kinsale, so it made the tour quite interesting.

On Friday, our first day of golf was at Fota Island Golf Club, a parkland course in the Cork area. We were prepared for rain, so naturally we had a brief shower, but otherwise the weather was good for our first day of golf.

On Day 3, Saturday, we experienced lunch and golf at Old Head Golf Links on the Atlantic Ocean. Before teeing off, we all shook hands with our bride through the Stone of Accord. This stone has a hole through which the Celts would finalize a contract of marriage. A little history lesson: What famous ship was sunk by the Germans 8 miles off Kinsale's Old Head in 1915? (Answer: Lusitania) Old Head provided spectacular views from it's many cliffside holes with the waves washing into the crags below.

Kinsale is reputed to be the gourmet capital of Ireland. After golf, we all had a great dinner at the Fishy Fishy Restaurant. You may not eat more freshly caught and delicious seafood. That is saying a lot from we Marylanders.

On Sunday, we changed our location from Cork to Killarney. The sightseeing tour led us to the town of Kenmare and onto the Eastern section of The Ring Of Kerry. From this drive, we overlooked the Lakes of Killarney and walked the grounds of the Muckross House, a mansion built in 1843 in Elizabethan style. We arrived at the Ross Castle Lodge B&B in Killarney in time for music and a brew or two at several of the local pubs while

watching the replay of the Gaelic football match between Limerick and Kerry. This is not the type of football as we know it in the US, but a very interesting game.

Monday, we played Dooks Golf Club, one of the oldest courses in Ireland, dating to 1889 built as a 9-holer and expanded to 18 holes in 1970. The course overlooks Dingle Bay with views of the McGillicuddy Mountains.

Tuesday, we weather 20-25 mph winds and rain coming down sideways playing Waterville Golf Club. A great meal at Smugglers Inn near the golf course made the day more enjoyable.

Day 7, Wednesday was a day of rest from golfing. We toured the Dingle Peninsula which we all felt offered some of Ireland's most beautiful scenery. Upon returning to Killarney, we again found the pubs calling us to drink, craic and enjoy the Irish music.

Thursday, we played Tralee Golf Club built in 1896 as a 9-holer and later designed and expanded to 18 holes by Arnold Palmer. The saying goes that Palmer was responsible for the front 9 and God is credited for the back 9. Nothing could be truer. Back in Killarney, we found the pubs and music calling us.

Friday, we checked out of our B&B and make our way the Ballybunion Golf Club for our last round of golf. We again survived a day of rain. That evening the Gossards left us for their trip to Dublin while the Carnes & Strocks spent the night at Buntratty Manor near Shannon Airport for flights back to the US on Saturday and Sunday.

Needless to say, it was a memorable trip with great golf courses, fun, food and fellowship.
