



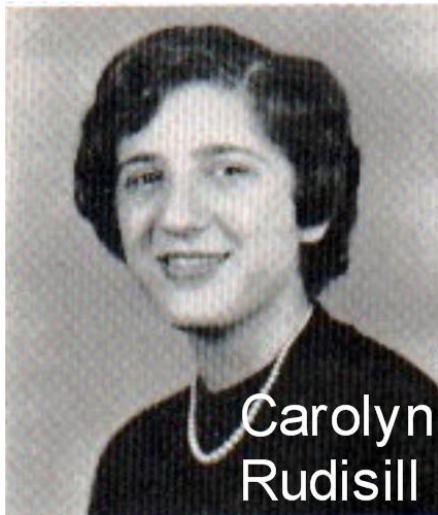

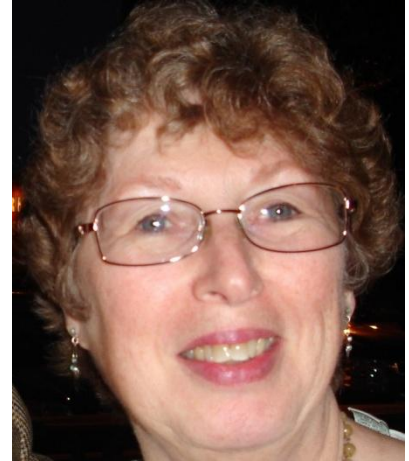

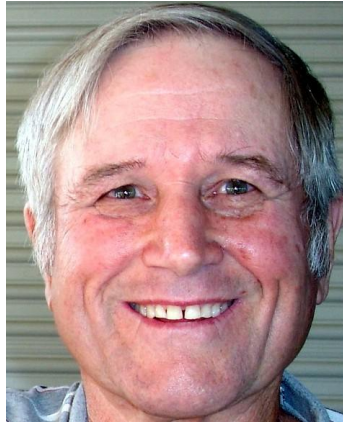

1990 Georgia Tech National Championship Reunion

The weekend of November 12, 13 & 14, Georgia Tech honored the 1990 National Championship football team with a 20th year reunion. Cindy and Terry Strock were among over 120 players, managers, coaches, trainers and administrators who attended the festivities.

The weekend kicked off on Friday evening with a Welcome Reception at the Hotel Palomar. On Saturday, there was a Pre-game tailgate followed by the 1990 players and coaches leading this year's team on the Yellow Jacket Alley Walk. The players and coaches were recognized at halftime of the Miami-Georgia Tech game. Unfortunately, the day ended with a disappointing loss to Miami.

The 1990 Georgia Tech team had an 11-0-1 record including a 45-21 victory against Nebraska in the Citrus Bowl. They were voted # 1 in the UPI Coaches Poll & in the Sporting News Poll. The AP Poll (Sports Writers) selected Colorado #1 and Georgia Tech #2. The Head Coach was Bobby Ross who had come to Georgia Tech in 1987 after 5 successful seasons at The University of Maryland. Terry was fortunate enough to be hired by Coach Ross in March 1990 to coach the wide receivers. Other coaches on the staff included, Ralph Friedgen, presently the Head Coach at the University of Maryland, Danny Smith, the Special Teams coach of the Washington Redskins and Brian Baker, who played for Ross at Maryland.

We enjoyed seeing and reliving the special moments with the players, meeting their wives and children. This was a very special group of student-athletes. They all have achieved success in their chosen field of work.
