

beautiful, beautiful city. I would love to live there for a few years. It was the "trip of a lifetime" except for the long flights from and back to LA and the jet lag!







Career(s)	I devoted my entire career to teaching children with disabilities and high school students at risk of failing and thus not graduating. I have written several curriculums. While teaching at the School for the Blind in Aberdeen, South Dakota, I co-authored a daily living skills curriculum, emphasizing core academic subjects for students who were blind and visually impaired and who were also developmentally delayed. This curriculum was titled, Special Studies for Special Students. I also wrote a vocational education curriculum for the school, which addressed the special vocational needs of these students. While teaching at Bismarck High School in Bismarck, North Dakota, I wrote two curriculums. One was an independent career development curriculum and the other was a service-learning curriculum. Both were written to address the

	needs of specific students. Those at risk of not graduating from high school could take these courses for credit, which counted toward their graduation requirements. The North Dakota Department of Public Instruction adopted the service-learning curriculum. It is available for use by all high schools in North Dakota. While teaching at Bismarck High School, I was given several awards. Twice I received the North Dakota Vocational Special Needs Teacher of the Year award. And once I received the regional Vocational Special Needs Teacher of the Year award, representing 23 states. In addition I was the recipient of the Director's Award of Excellence by the North Dakota Department of Career and Technical Education.
