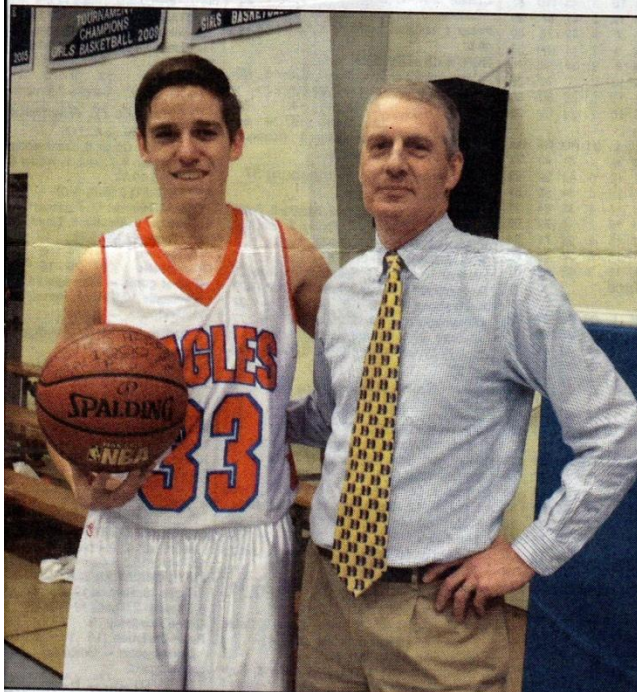

At our Church we make a special effort to honor our military veterans in a number of ways. 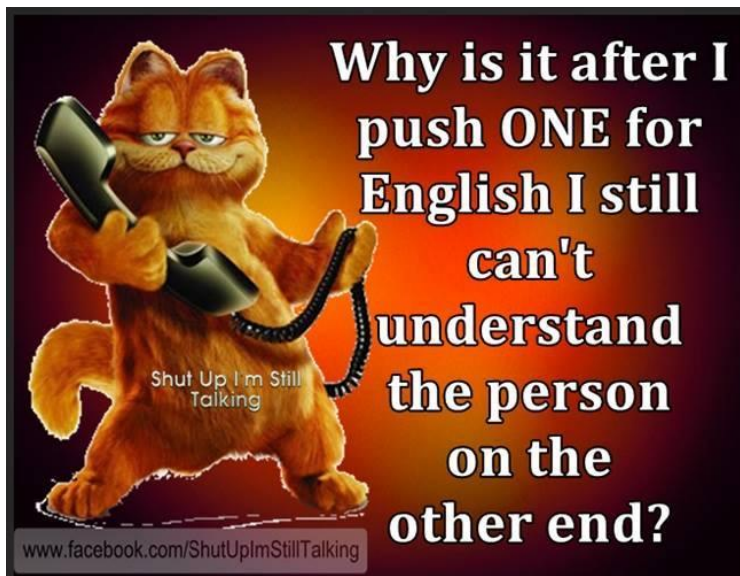
