Our daughter Angie is the Program and Event Director at the Orange County Marathon Foundation. As such, she conducts a “Kids Run The OC.” Through their schools, the kids accumulate 25 miles of training prior to the “Kids Run The OC” on the Saturday before the real OC Marathon on Sunday. On that Saturday they run the final 1.2 miles to complete their full 26.2 mile marathon. The effort is aimed at children getting regular, age appropriate exercise and to modify behavior to make good nutritional choices.

Each student who completes the program is awarded the same marathon medal as the Sunday runners. It is hung around their neck during a school assembly with all the students in attendance. Since Angie started the program, it has grown from 900 to 6,500 students and with 82 Orange County schools participating this year.

In addition, Angie has obtained partners like Target and The Magic Shoe Foundation so students who need shoes can receive sneakers so they can participate in the program.

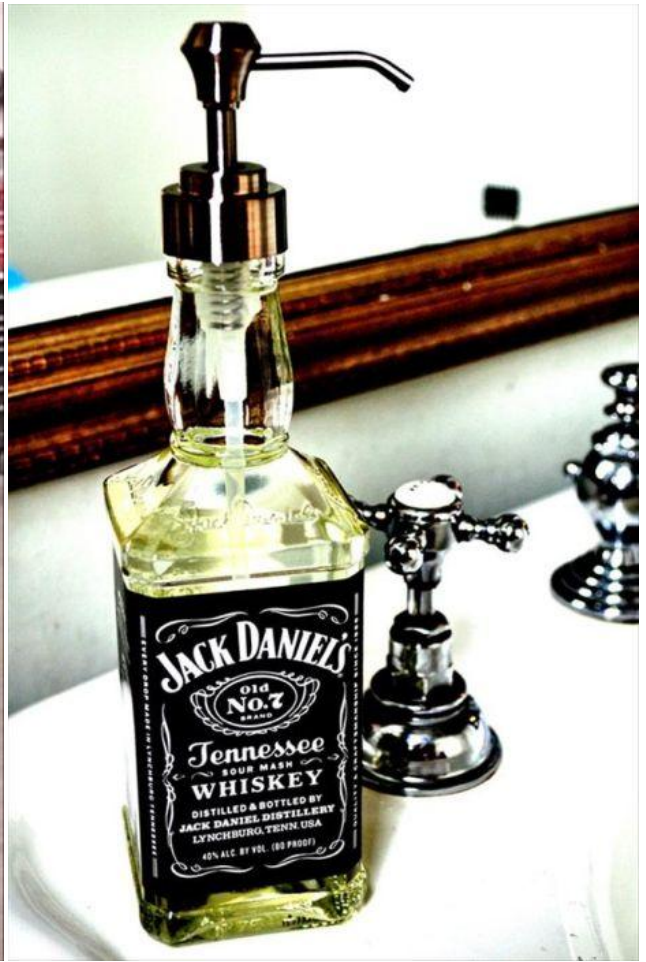

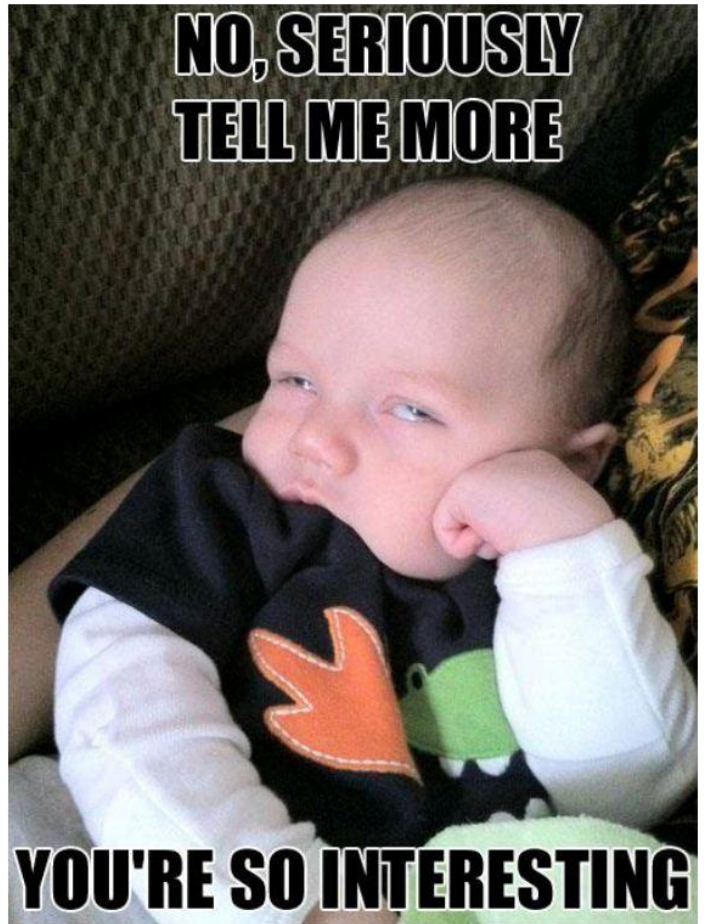

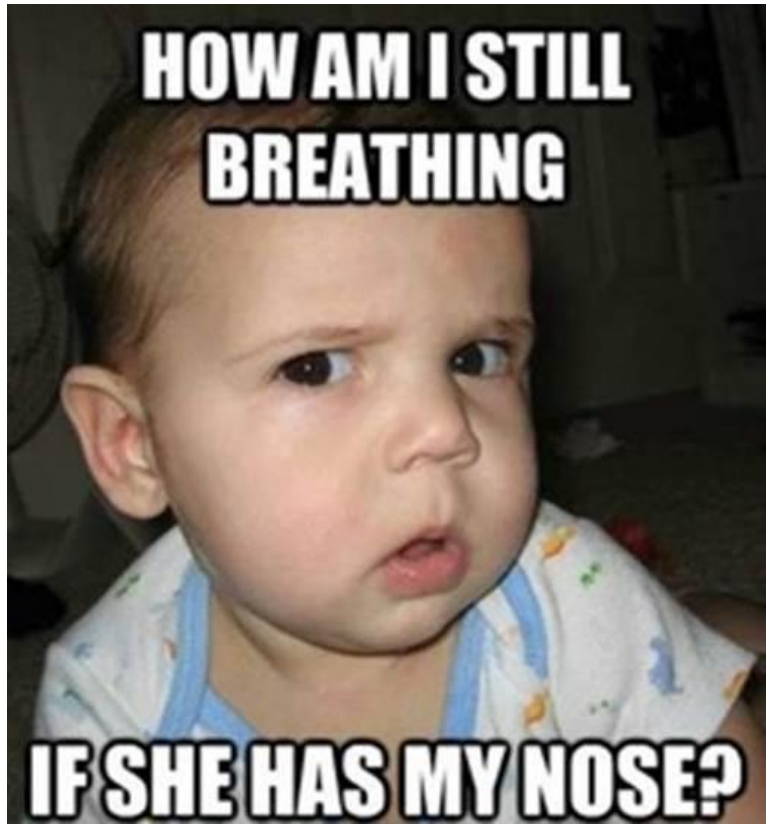
