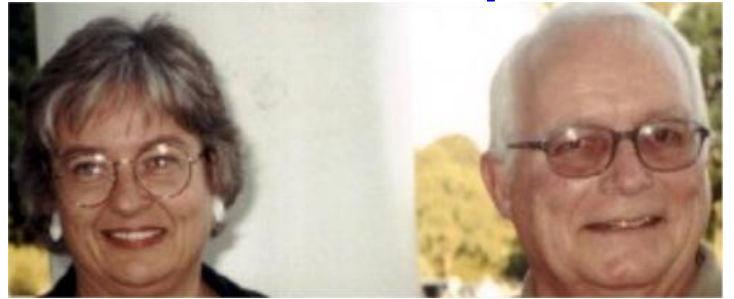

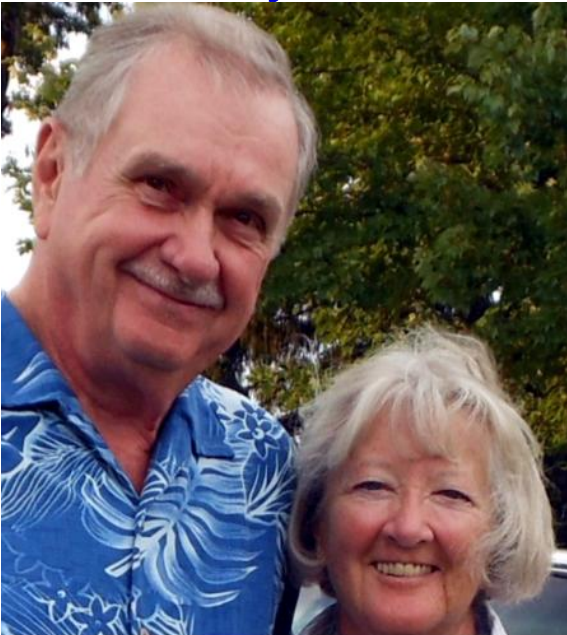

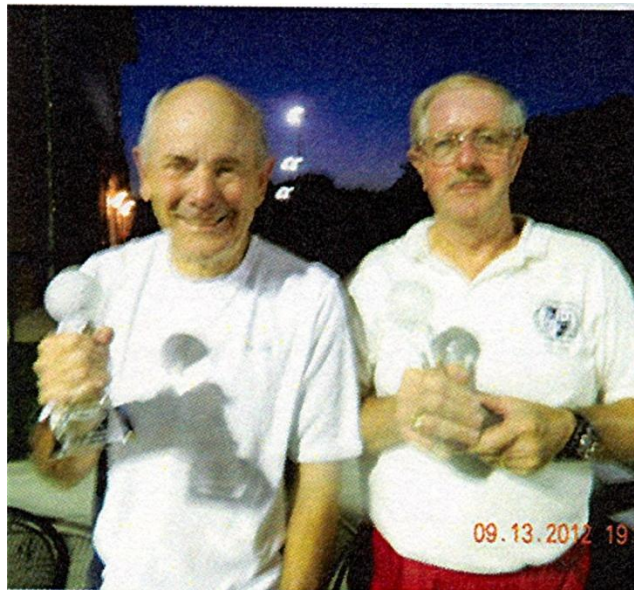
CLASSMATE ACTIVITIES

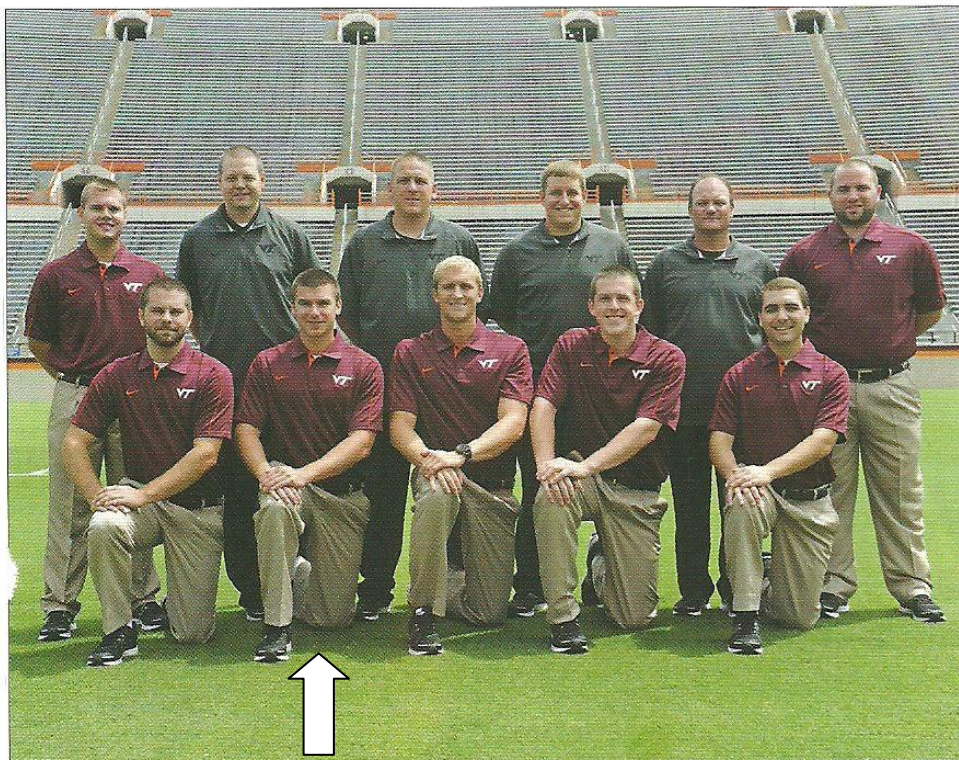

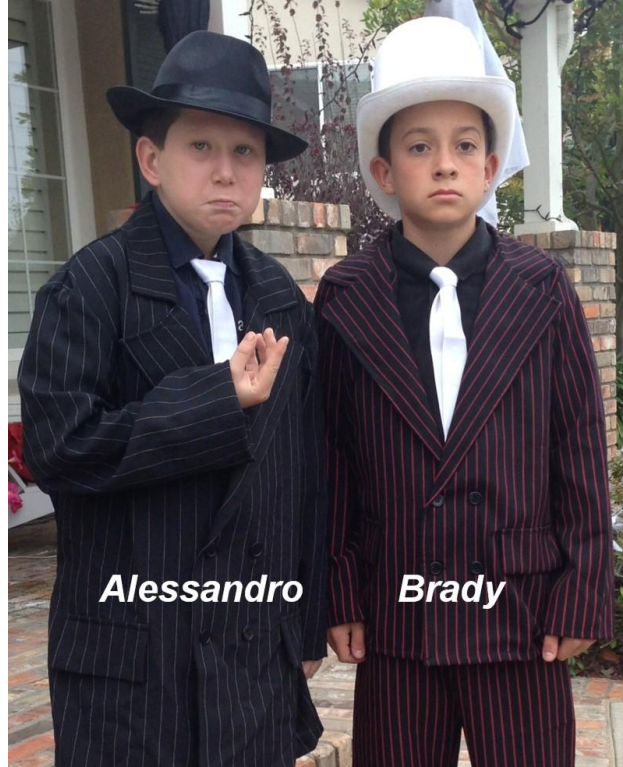

'Why?' he asked.

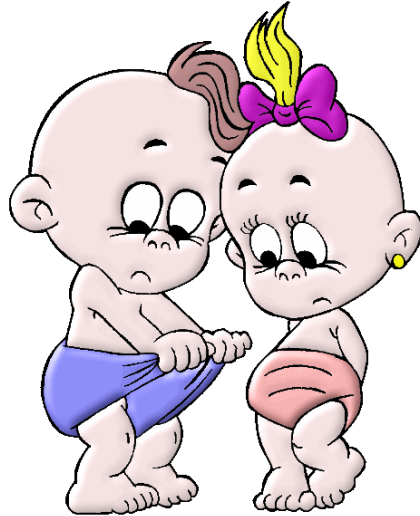
She pointed to her lap and said 'Cause I'm starting to grow little feathers down there!'
