Just wanted to report on my month long teaching assignment in Muscat, Oman from 16 Sep-14 Oct. I received a call Tuesday, 13 Sep from the person in charge of dispatching Franklin University professors to foreign countries, asking if I could be on a plane That Friday to go to Oman for a month! After driving to and from Detroit to renew my expired passport, I had a day to meet with course designer and finance personnel, pack for an extended period, and depart for my fourth teaching trip to Oman since 2014.

I was a "Visiting Scholar" from Franklin scheduled to teach a Human Resource Management course, which I had not previously taught at the Modern College of Business and Science. I stayed in an apartment which was a 10 minute walk and a 6 lane road crossing from the college. It was a bit warm (90-100 degrees) in a coat & tie, carrying a heavy briefcase with laptop and text. I worked directly with a PhD from India in an office that included 7 educators from India, one from Pakistan, one from Serbia, one from Kenya, and two Omanis. It was a pleasant experience in that the entire office treated me as a full time professor, like one of them.

I had 30 female and 3 male undergraduate Muslim students during a morning and afternoon class from Sunday through Thursday for the four weeks. The Islamic holy day is Friday. Courses are structured to allow for prayer throughout the day. My female Omani students wore the traditional black Abaya, which covers the hair to the floor but exposes the full face. A couple of women from other countries wore western wear and covered their hair. The men either wore traditional white robes with caps or western wear. All of the students speak and write in English, which counters my very limited Arabic! They all worked hard and all passed. They were fun to work with, and I've had some nice e-mails from them since I've been back.

While there I was asked to prepare and presented a power point presentation on leadership to the entire faculty. Separately, the Omani Dean of the college asked me to present my various entrepreneurial business experiences to a group of around 100 students. Both presentations were well received.


Oman is a very safe country to visit and work. More than 30% of the total population is made up of expatriates from India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, and other foreign countries. I had no fear taking long walks during day or night free time. Having traveled around the country during previous visits, I didn't have time to do so this visit. It's a beautiful, safe, and well educated country. I highly recommend a trip there.

At this writing I am in the middle of a 4 day Navy flying squadron reunion at the Hilton San Diego Bayfront Hotel in beautiful San Diego, CA. It's the 6th such

reunion I've planned in various parts of the country, and Sharon says the last! I admit that it is a bit stressful, but the bond we all share, especially from combat in Vietnam makes it very worthwhile and meaningful.
